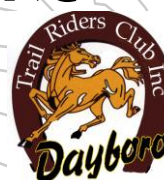

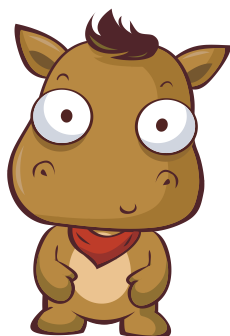

After leaving the show grounds we headed down Fingerboard Road into Small's property and up the big scenic hill. As we usually come down this hill at the end of a ride it was really interesting to go up the other way and amazing how different things look when you go in reverse. Going up the hill we looked back to see a great view of Dayboro and the show grounds. There were a couple of rest and catch up stops on the way up with a nice grassy paddock at the top for the horses to have a quick graze. After a nice long ride down the other side we headed back up another couple of hills to get a great view of the city at the top. A few riders decided they couldn't go up that last hill so waited at the bottom for us near the dam. They still got a view to the city as we went around the side of the hill. A bit later on we had a couple of creek crossings with a nice cool drink for the horses in the running water. We rode along Raean Road to Dayboro Road then under the Rush Creek bridge.

We followed the track next to the main road for awhile until we couldn't go any further due to the track being washed out from the recent rain. This didn't faze anyone as the trail riders are pretty good at taking detours. Instead we went through Bradley's property and up to the goldfish water-trough with a short stop for the horses to have a drink. Some were a bit unsure, some had their noses tickled by the goldfish and some tried to go fishing with their eyes nearly disappearing in the water. We then made our way back through the paddock, across the little muddy crossing that some horses insist on jumping every time we cross it, through the gum trees, back out onto the main road near the dump and home to the show grounds via Fingerboard Road. It was a very scenic ride which we all enjoyed but by the time we got back we were all starving and ready for a BBQ.

On Saturday 28 March, a Horsefloat was stolen from Fig Tree Pocket Equestrian Centre, Fig Tree Pocket, between 7.30am and 8.00am. Contents of the float included all tack – saddles, bridles grooming etc. Side panels are open with white vinyl covers over. Rear cover is vinyl roll up 2 piece and zippered. Decal on front of float is of showjumping horse. Internal 2 horse straight load with fully padded side and front bars, 2 Side doors, LED trailer lights, internal fluoro light. Gas struts on tailgate.
