U October Ride Report by Arthur Kent & Bob Ebert

This year's ride was the biggest we have held with 126 on the short ride and 86 on the long ride. Both rides left the show grounds, escorted by our friendly policeman, Troy; with backup provided by the rural fire brigade and Apex doing the poo pick up run. The ride turned on to Mount Mee Road; William's Street; McKenzie Street and on to the cemetery where the short ride turned off while the long ride continued on to Sellin Road. It was also at this point that the police and fire brigade returned to their bases.

The long ride continued through Neilsen's; Craig Doyle's; McKay's, where three riders pulled out due to lame horses, and one rider became dislodged – fortunately injury free – and resumed the ride on to Desley Bond's and Rahe Road for the smoko break of biscuits, cold drinks and oranges.

It was then on to Ross and Debbie Sellin's; Bond's again; Kevin Sellin's and Townsend's property where

John Barry, on his horse (Muscles) doubled a young rider while her pony was led up the steep climb. At the top the ride was met by the backup crew for more refreshments and after the break went out to the lookout for photo shoots and views of the picturesque Dayboro valley with Brisbane city in the distance. The ride then continued along Townsend Road to Graham and Lorraine Bailey's property at Oceanview for the lunch stop. The one hour break allowed for food, drinks and toilet opportunities. Four riders who lived locally decided to leave the ride here for a variety of reasons.

Afterwards the ride continued along Oceanview Road and Moorina Road taking in the magnificent views of Glasshouse Mountains and Moreton Bay. And it was here that some riders, so engrossed with the scenery, missed the right turn. However Kevin and Graham rounded them up to carry on through Pioneer with a few stops to allow the tail to catch up safely.

The next drinks break was at the last creek before Will Bradley's where Selwyn thanked riders for their participation and patience, before continuing on through Joe Bradley's, Dayboro Road, Fingerboard Road, Mount Mee Road, to arrive safely back to the showgrounds at 5pm.

The short ride went down Riverview Drive, but before we left the cemetery we had a lame horse which required floating home. Unfortunately, it had never been on a straight load float and along the road it jumped the chest bar and became lodged between the front of the float and the chest bar. However, thanks to Dougal and Christie having a float which can be pulled apart they were able to free the horse through the front door. The other riders were unaware of this drama until they were on Glover Road.

After leaving Riverview Drive the ride turned on to Hillview Court and through the park "with no name", across the North Pine River on to Humble's property. Some riders took the long way (missing the horse tracks) on to Glover Road, Richardson's, Baker's and previously Angela's. As the ride had been going so well we decided to hold up here so that Chris could

catch up due to so many hard to shut gates close together. The ride then went in to Baker's again and down to the smoko stop, arriving before the backup crew as the ride had made such good time. However, when they did arrive everyone enjoyed the cold drinks, biscuits and oranges. After smoko one horse was found to be lame and was left in the yards for collection later.

The ride continued through Baker's to Rowe Road and Lacey's Creek Road, where traffic was held up until riders reached John Edmond's property. Next was into the river and up a steep pinch on to the river bank at Flewell-Smith's, Hillview Court, Riverview Drive, McKenzie Street, Don Kerr Memorial Drive and back to the showgrounds for lunch.

The club sincerely thanks the backup crews for all they do, for without them the ride would not be possible. Particular thanks to Dougal and Christie for their float and apologies for any damages. Thanks also to policeman Troy, the Rural Fire Brigade, Apex, any club member who assisted in any way and to non members who help each year. Don't forget to BRING YOUR OWN chair, drinks, plates, cutlery, cups and napkins.



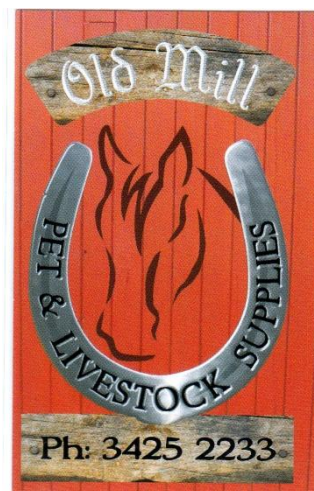

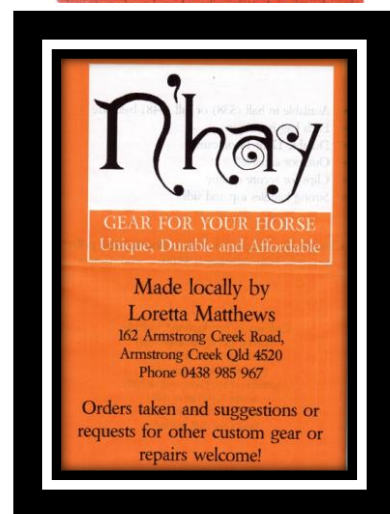
