WESTERN BARREL SADDLE

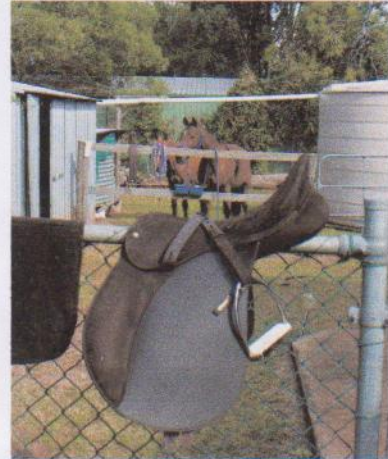
