# RECEIPES FROM LISA

## Mixed Berry Tea Cake

- |                             |   |
|-----------------------------|---|
| 1 ½ cups self raising flour | 60gm butter melted                        |
| ½ cup ground almond meal    | 1 orange                                  |
| ½ cup caster sugar          | ½ pkt frozen mixed berries or blueberries |
| 1 egg                       | 2 tbsp caster sugar, extra                |
| 2/3 cup milk                |   |

- Preheat oven to 180°c then grease a 22cm cake tin and line base with baking paper.
- Combine flour, almond meal and caster sugar in a large bowl.
- Whisk egg, milk and melted butter together until combined.
- Finely grate rind from the orange and set aside.
- Juice orange and add ¼ cup juice to the egg mixture.
- Pour liquid into flour mixture and stir with a wooden spoon until well combined.
- Pour into cake tin and scatter with mixed berries or blueberries.
- Combine the orange rind and extra caster sugar, rubbing between fingertips (only do this when you are ready to put it on the cake or it will turn to liquid).
- Sprinkle over the top of the whole cake.
- Bake for 25 minutes or until a skewer in the centre comes out clean.
- Leave in tin for 5 minutes then transfer to wire rack to cool.

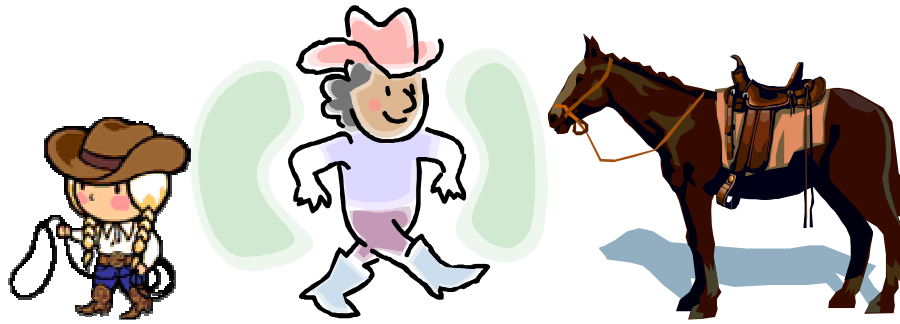

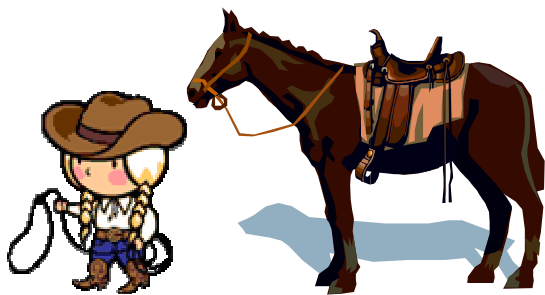
