Itinerary

Friday: Campers welcome - Sign on available

Saturday: 4 hour (approx.) ride leaving 8:30am. Morning tea will be provided on the Saturday ride, as well as cooked basics breakfast (Saturday morning only) for purchase around 6:30am.

Sunday 3 hour (approx.) ride leaving 8:30am.

Any other meals are BYO – no breakfast or morning tea meals are being cooked on the Sunday. Suggested to bring a small bag with water and snacks (muesli bars, crackers, biscuits) if you're riding.

TRA member's prices are \$15 for one ride or \$20 for both rides. Non-members are \$25 for one ride or \$40 for both rides. Free camping, toilets and hot showers available. Dogs welcome to come to the camping grounds but not to come on rides or too close to others horses.

We may be lucky enough to have a hot bore water shower by camp time, otherwise bring your shower.


Cost is \$10.00 per person for the weekend. Children under 13 are free.



Horse Health Declaration Form

We have been notified by the Show Society that we all now must fill out a Horse Health Declaration form every time we do a ride from the showgrounds. I have attached the form for you to download. We will also keep some in the shed in case you forget to bring one.

We have revised the Horse Health Declaration form by adding our Club and the TRA logo. If you have old copies printed off then they are quite okay to use, also there are old copies in the club shed that we will use until they are all gone.

Once these forms are filled out, they will be given to the show society to keep on file after each ride.





- The visitor fee is higher because part of this goes to TRA for insurance.
- For members/volunteers that are doing sign-on before a ride, a sign-on price list will be available on the table stating that the fee is the same whether you have lunch or not.



September Ride Report

A lovely sunny day welcomed sixteen horse riders to Dayboro for our Trail Ride on Sunday 23rd September. As with most of our rides we have our regulars whose horses will go anywhere they are asked. Our visitors who join us on our rides are often riding inexperienced horses that have not been exposed to the obstacles that we routinely come across on our trails. Prior to every ride we check and clear the trails, but this preparation is not always enough for some horses. Even in the driest time of year the gullies we cross remain boggy, especially if they are frequently used by cattle.

Our first muddy encounter for our green horse in the group was in Tullamore Park at the beginning of our ride and he wasn't going to get his feet wet no matter how much his rider tried to coax him. Eventually a drier section was found that was more to his liking.

We were then on our way, once safely across Williams Street at the Bakery, we headed along Railway Street to Mrs Butler's property where we rode along the old rail trail. When we reached Strong Road we made our way past all the curious cattle, crossed the bridge, then went into Mark Anderson's paddock which took us up our first small hill climb. As we went into Warren Ebert's it got a bit steeper, but instead of going all the way up to the tower we followed a track that took us around the side of the hill, making it a lot less work for our horses.

After going through to an adjoining paddock and letting the horses have a quick drink at the trough we then crossed Dayboro Road and went into the Bradley's Dairy paddock. A few horses headed to 'The Big Fish Bowl', but not all of them would drink from a cattle trough which is home to some very overgrown goldfish that swam under their noses.

Heading downhill brought us to another gully. We had plenty of time to take in the natural beauty of the area, while the green horse dug his toes in again and refused to cross. Finally, he was over and we had another four shallow creeks and gullies to negotiate before our climb up the mountain in Hansen's Quarry; surely he would be getting the idea by now!

Our group continued along the trail after crossing the next creek and waited out of sight hoping the young horse would be more inclined to conquer his fear and choose to re-join us, but no that didn't work either. By this time his rider was exhausted and he was working up a sweat just standing there. Meanwhile, our horses were having a lovely time, just relaxing and eating grass while we chatted and waited.

It may sound as though we spend most of our time riding the most challenging terrain we can find. But, we enjoy the beauty that is found in the bush and along the rivers and creeks, far away from busy roads. Some of the trails we ride are only used by wallabies and a few cattle. No hikers, mountain bikes or 4 wheel drives to look out for. It's just us on horseback enjoying the serenity. 'So much serenity'!

Our ride continued up and over the mountain with no further hold-ups. We exited out onto Fingerboard Road through Alex Bell's property and it seemed to take no time at all to get back to the Club House. After four hours in the saddle the horses were washed down and left to relax and munch through some hay while we enjoyed our lunch. As for the green horse, we look forward to seeing him again. With a bit more training he'll be a no fuss trail riding horse that will be happy to lead us on our trails.





Our Club rides are held on the 4th Sunday of the month but for dates check the calendar on our website.

Club rides are generally about 3 to 4 hours, departing the Dayboro Showgrounds on Mt Mee Road, Dayboro at 8:30am sharp.

After each ride we have a friendly BBQ lunch.

Throughout the year we have weekend rides away such as Yarraman, Kin Kin & TRA camps.

We have junior, adult and family memberships available.

Riders to be at the grounds by 8:00am, saddled up and signed on at the club house.

Riders under 18 must wear an approved helmet. It is a recommendation of this club and TRA that helmets are worn by all riders. Riders 16 years and under must be accompanied on ride by an adult.



We are affiliated with **Trail Riding Australia** Inc and as such we ride under the TRA Code of Conduct. To participate in our rides, riders must be members of a TRA affiliated club or pay the appropriate "Matter Fee" to be eligible to ride. There is no personal accident insurance for riders but the Club is insured for public liability insurance.



We have one buckle left at \$22 and a few hat pins left at \$13.






