



Horse Health Declaration Form

We have been notified by the Show Society that we all now must fill out a Horse Health Declaration form every time we do a ride from the showgrounds. I have attached the form for you to download. We will also keep some in the shed in case you forget to bring one.

We have revised the Horse Health Declaration form by adding our Club and the TRA logo. If you have old copies printed off then they are quite okay to use, also there are old copies in the club shed that we will use until they are all gone. Once these forms are filled out, they will be given to the show society to keep on file after each ride.





April Ride Report

Dayboro turned on the perfect weather for our Trail Ride on the 22nd April. Although, overnight there was some heavy rain that made some of our tracks a bit boggy. Our ride began on time and with eleven riders we left the Show Ground, went under the bridge on Mt Mee Road, then along Fingerboard Road to Old Dayboro Road. We hadn't travelled very far before one of our visiting riders had a calamity when her stirrup leather suddenly broke. She was completely unperturbed and continued on with only one stirrup and considering the steepness of some of the terrain we travelled, that was quite impressive riding.

We made our way past Bradley's inquisitive herd of dairy cattle. With the assistance of a lovely young lady sporting the mandatory fashion accessory for a dairy farm (gum boots), who came trudging through the mud to open and shut gates for us, we were hastily through before any of the cows could sneak out the open gateway. Heading in the direction of the mountain, our first attempt at finding the gate on top of the ridge was an epic fail! But as we spelled the horses before riding back down we took in the amazing view and got some great photos.

Not wanting to tire everyone's horses, it was just Mary Ann, Sue and myself who rode up the next ridge while the remainder of the group sat in the shade of the trees and relaxed. This time the gate was located, but after pulling away the vines and lantana we found it had been padlocked. So, plan B was put into action. We would go to the gate that we usually go through, even though we hadn't brought along the key and just try our luck. The good part about exploring is we discover other tracks to ride that we haven't been on before. This can turn out to be even better than our known routes that we usually take. Thanks to the cattle we were able to avoid turning back again. If there is a way around an obstacle or through a tricky gully, cows find it. All we had to do was find the cattle tracks, and sure enough, we were back on track in no time.

With the unplanned route changes, we had taken a bit longer to get into the Quarry land, so a quick change in direction was required to shorten our ride. From the start of our ride to the highest point was a change in elevation of 300 metres, which probably explains why Dayboro Trail Riders have the fittest horses when we visit other Trail Riding Clubs. We allowed time for the horses to rest as we made our way up and for boots to be put on any of the barefoot horses that don't travel well on the rocky trails.

All was going well as we made our descent back down to Dayboro, or so I thought! One of the important unwritten rules of being a Lead Drover is removal of all the Golden Orb spiders from the trail. Evidently, when riding in the lead on one of the shortest horses in the Club, a much longer stick is mandatory to prevent those following behind on big thoroughbreds from adorning their helmets with our eight-legged friends. The shrieks that echo throughout the bush are not always birds!

Upon reaching the bottom of the mountain we exited onto Fingerboard Road from Alex Bell's property and returned along the same path we travelled earlier. After riding just over fifteen kilometres in four hours we were back at the Show Grounds. Fortunately, Ken hadn't thrown the chicken burgers on the barbie until he saw us coming home. As usual we finished with a perfectly cooked lunch.

It was a very sunny day, we had four riders represent the club, Janelle, Mary Ann, Debbie and Julie.



New riders always welcome at Dayboro Trail Riders Club. Bring your horse and enjoy riding in the beautiful Dayboro valley.

Our Club rides are held on the 4th Sunday of the month but for dates check the calendar on our website.

Club rides are generally about 3 to 4 hours, departing the Dayboro Showgrounds on Mt Mee Road, Dayboro at 8:30am sharp.

After each ride we have a friendly BBQ lunch.

Throughout the year we have weekend rides away such as Yarraman, Kin Kin & TRA camps.

We have junior, adult and family memberships available.

Riders to be at the grounds by 8:00am, saddled up and signed on at the club house.

Riders under 18 must wear an approved helmet. It is a recommendation of this club and TRA that helmets are worn by all riders. Riders 16 years and under must be accompanied on ride by an adult.



We are affiliated with **Trail Riding Australia** Inc and as such we ride under the TRA Code of Conduct. To participate in our rides, riders must be members of a TRA affiliated club or pay the appropriate "Visitor Fee" to be eligible to ride. There is no personal accident insurance for riders but the Club is insured for public liability insurance.






